Volunteers' Update - the stats!

February 2016 Volunteers' Update:

- sent to 521 Committee Members
- 263 people opened the update (50.5%)
- 67 people clicked on links (12.9%)

Localgiving

If any Local Groups would like to set up a fundraising page to collate donations online from Members who are fundraising for a local event then you may want to set up a webpage with Localgiving. With Localgiving you need to register as an unregistered charity. We have confirmed with Localgiving that even though Local Groups technically fall under Coeliac UK, because your Local Group is raising funds locally and these are going into your Local Group bank account you can register as a group.

In September 2015 they introduced their GF accreditation in five stores and have now launched the second phase and accredited ten more stores across the UK, including Fish'n'chick'n, Bankers Express and Churchill's. They have a gluten-free menu served

weekly and have trained over 50 members of staff to ensure that everyone is aware of how to cater for people following a gluten-free diet.
